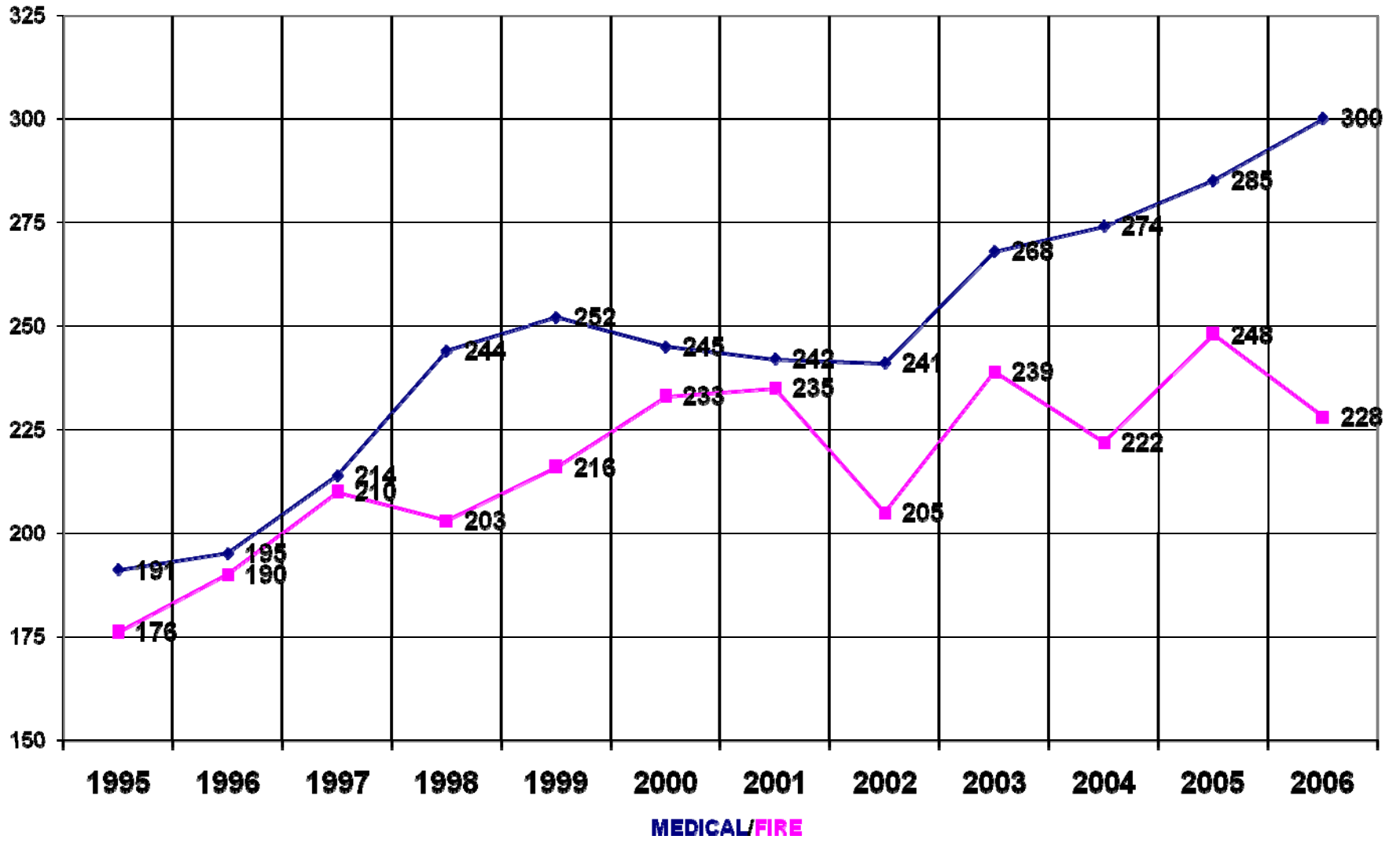

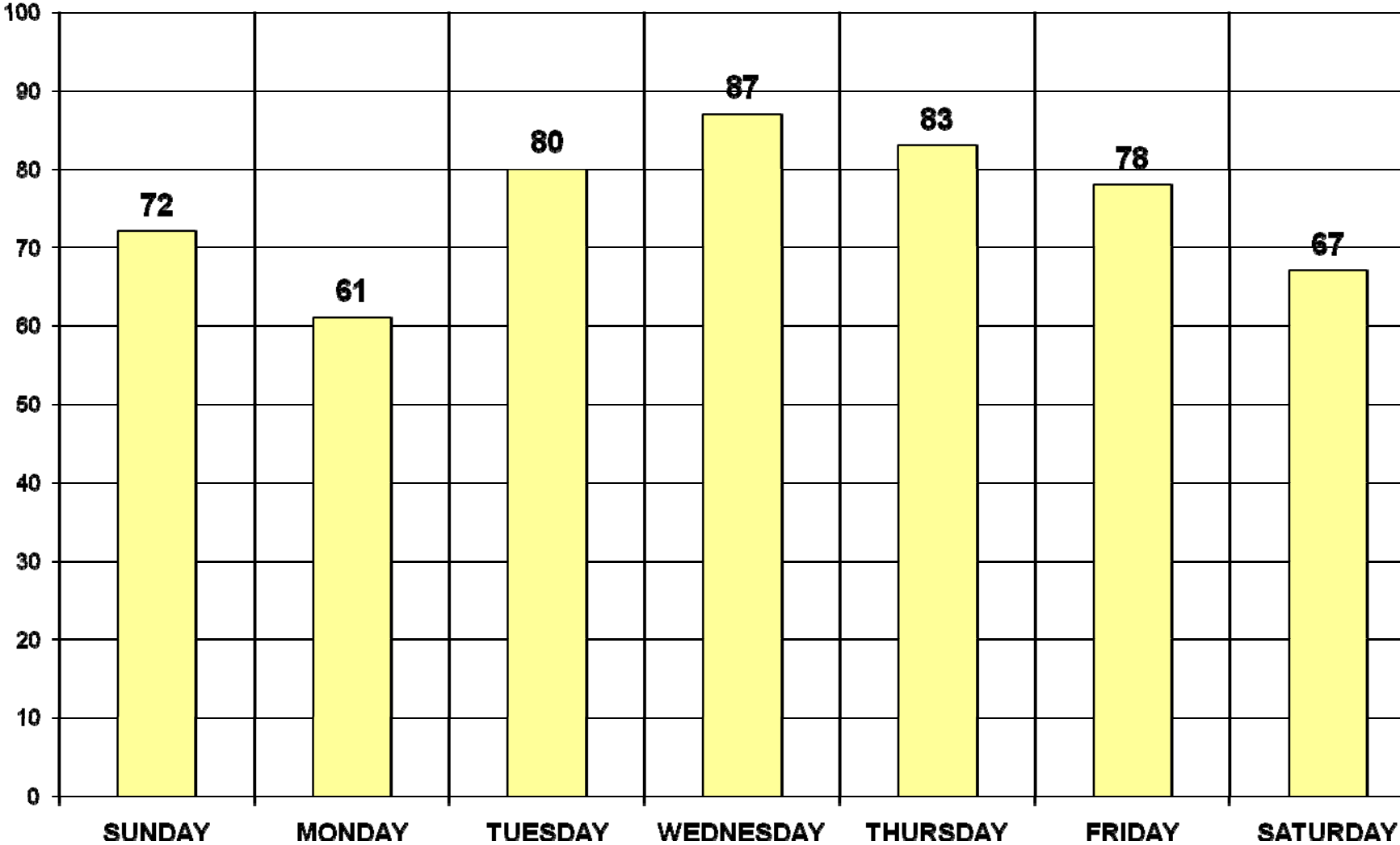
CALL RESPONSE COMPARISON 2006
